Tradition to Cherish - Anudeepa Kadiresan - 3 -14 May 2023 - Opening Celebration: 6 May, 6pm - 8 pm

'Tradition to Cherish' by Anudeepa Kadiresan, is a celebration of Indian Culture and a reflection of Anudeepa's own journey as a member of Indian diaspora.

It offers a unique perspective on the intersection of tradition and modernity, and invites viewers to explore their own connections to cultural heritage and identity. The exhibition features a variety of media, including painting, drawings, and mixed media works. Many of the works incorporate traditional Indian elements, colors, intricate patterns, and symbolism drawn from Hindu mythology.

About the Artist

Anudeepa Kadiresan is an Indian artist who has lived in Australia for 20 years. Her art explores Indian culture and traditions, and aims to give voice to the experiences of the Indian diaspora in Australia.

'How do you do?' is the first solo art exhibition by emerging artist Sara Fung. Sara has been residing in Australia for four years, during which she has made numerous new friends and explored several stunning locations within this state.

Sara was born in Hong Kong, whilst her family hails from Singapore. While studying IT in the UK, she discovered her passion for painting, which had been with her since childhood. Along with her hobbies of hiking, working out, and learning new things, she enjoys visiting museums and collecting art books. Sara Fung welcomes you to join her in celebrating the joys of everyday life at her debut solo exhibition and find wonders in ordinary suburbs and the familiar country.

The success of this exhibition highlights the importance of supporting and promoting the arts. The committee looks forward to future events that celebrate the artistic talent of our community.






